By bringing the object back into use and making it appreciated again, we're recognising and caring for the materials God has given us, in this case wood, which required a tree, water and sunlight to be brought into being. We're also honouring the skill and effort of the person who made the piece in the first place, and all human work has value in God's world.

Upcycling of many types is, it seems, likely to be with us for some time, if only for economic reasons. Let's embrace it- we might even learn to enjoy it.
